

## **Catalogue of Eligible Costs under the competition ‘Grants for Grants’**

The following shall be considered eligible costs under the competition:

- 1) Costs of developing the concept and preparing the grant application related to:
  - a) conducting research related to the topic of the project application for the European Research Council, Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions, or other prestigious programmes, in particular those funded by the European Commission (outsourced services),
  - b) preparation, completion, or revision of the project application (outsourced services),
  - c) travel or participation of the Applicant in conferences, networking or brokerage meetings, or activities related to the preparation of the project application,
  - d) organisation of consortium or project team meetings, if the Applicant participates in the preparation of the project application as a work package leader (WP Leader);
- 2) Salary costs – additional remuneration for employees involved in the preparation of the international grant application. The total cost of additional remuneration for all involved employees must comply with the Remuneration Regulations for employees of Nicolaus Copernicus University in Toruń. The total amount of salaries planned in the application, including statutory contributions to DWR, ZUS, and PPK, shall not exceed 20% of the budgeted costs. Additional remuneration may be paid after the grant application has been submitted to an international institution under the European Research Council, Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions, or other prestigious programmes, in particular those funded by the European Commission;
- 3) A change between cost categories not exceeding a total of 10% of the amounts requested in individual categories in the application is permitted, excluding the salary category. Such a transfer must be reported to the IDUB Programme Section. Transfers between cost categories do not increase the awarded funding. The project manager shall explain any transfers made in the report.
